Four consecutive Friday nights of outdoor entertainment will highlight the 2014 Riverfront Park Concert Series which gets underway July 4.

The McCready Brothers of Truro have been playing together for more than 30 years. Join Jim and AT for an hour of easy-listening blues music, featuring guitar, vocals and harmonica.

Powerful vocal and acoustic performances by Truro's Adam Cotterill are rooted in much of the folk rock for which the Maritimes are known.
