Sledges

Sledges are used to allow participants with physical disabilities to enjoy a game of hockey or just to go for a sled on the ice. Players move on the ice by propelling their sled with sticks with picks.



We have 22 sledges with telescopic noses available for use, including right and left sticks with picks. There are 6 with wheel kits.

Duet Cycle

This “go anywhere” tandem bicycle is basically a wheelchair (which can be taken off) mounted to the front of a bike. It is surprisingly easy to pedal and allows the passenger to go “for a ride” in a comfortable seating position. Comes with an electric pack to assist those pedaling.

Snow Coaches

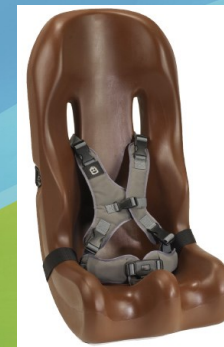

Padded seat, three safety straps, raised back support, head rest and steel runners. 220-lb. weight capacity. For riders with good head, neck and trunk control.

This sitter's contoured head and lateral supports are designed to position and support the child's head, and trunk into proper alignment. Made of a latex-free seamless material, impermeable to fluids. They feature a soft, durable material that is antimicrobial, and cleans easily



with common disinfectant.
