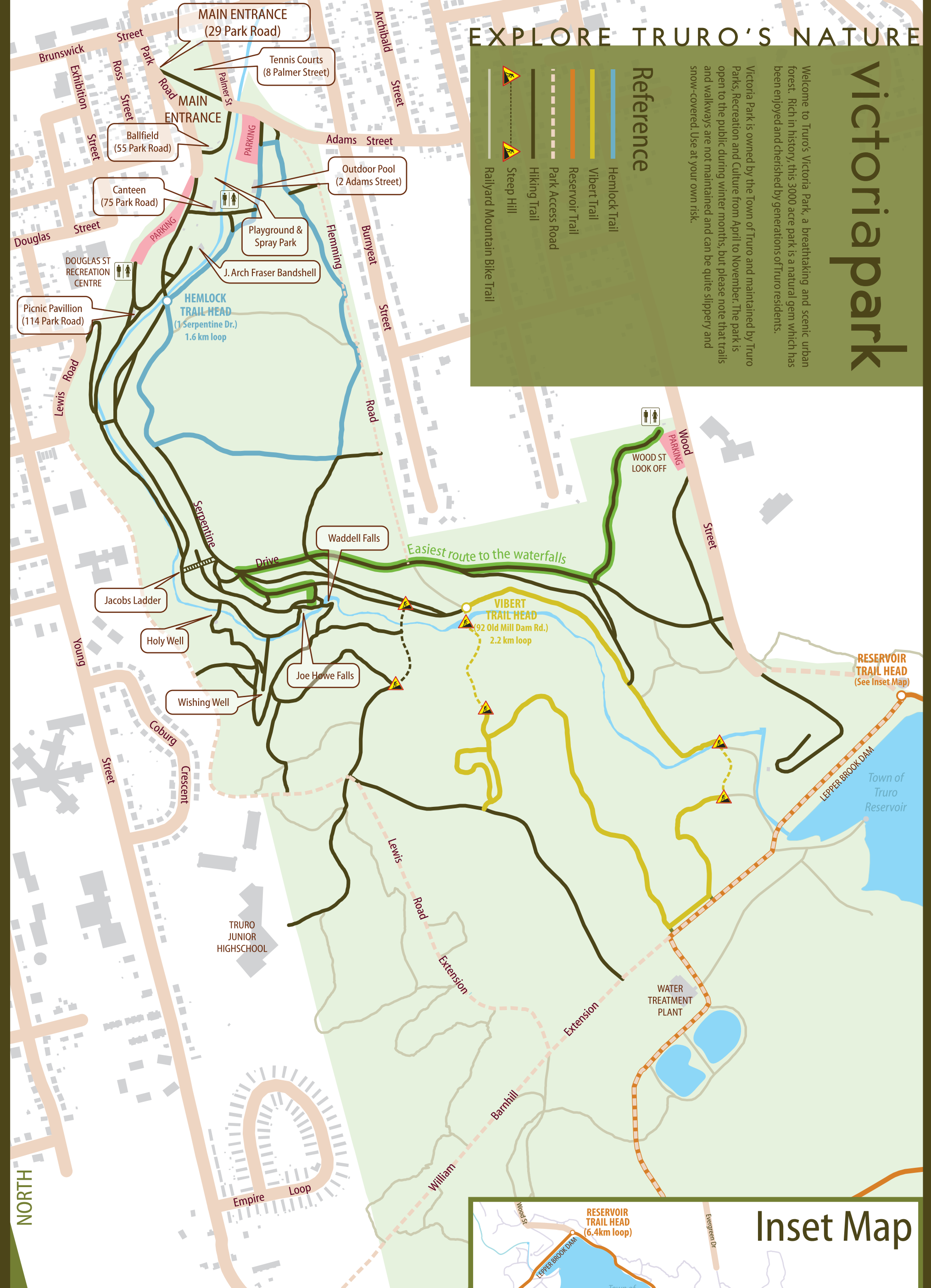
victoriapark

Welcome to Truro's Victoria Park, a breathtaking and scenic urban forest. Rich in history, this 3000 acre park is a natural gem which has been enjoyed and cherished by generations of Truro residents.

Victoria Park is owned by the Town of Truro and maintained by Truro Parks, Recreation and Culture from April to November. The park is open to the public during winter months, but please note that trails and walkways are not maintained and can be quite slippery and snow-covered. Use at your own risk.

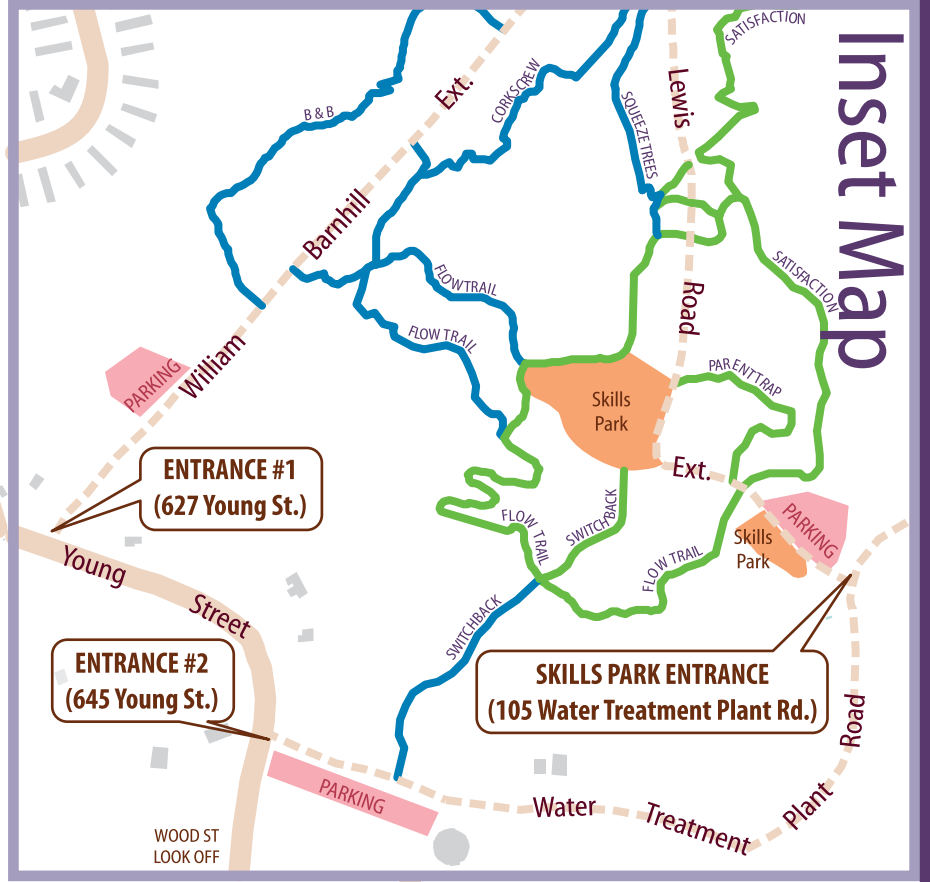
Distance From Main Parking Lot to Points of Interest
