If accepted, art - **along with a detailed artist biography** - must be dropped off at McCarthy Hall Gallery at NSCC Truro Campus, 36 Arthur St. on **Tuesday, April 2nd between 9:00 and 11:00 am** and **must be picked up on Friday, April 26th before 4:00 pm.**

All submissions must be prepared to gallery standards, ready for display. Paintings must have gallery standard frames with braided wire and screw eyes.

While security is a priority, it is recommended that artists insure their own work.

The committee has the right to refuse any entry which is deemed to be unsuitable.

Art Acquisition Program History

In 2006, the Town of Truro established an Art Acquisition Program to create and maintain a collection of visual art which reflects the unique historic and artistic development of Truro.

Each year proceeding, an annual Art Acquisition Show has been held where a Selection Committee views and purchases one piece of artwork from various submissions by local artists.

This selection is then placed on permanent public display in the Town of Truro Civic Building at 695 Prince St. Artist profiles are included in the display to show the history of the program over the years.

Selection Criteria

The Selection Committee takes each of the following into consideration when selecting a piece of art each year:

Quality Art: Originality, good composition, technical competence, presentation (in terms of preservation) and the relevance of the style and development of the artist.

The historic development and lifestyle of the Town of Truro: This is secondary, but will be considered.

Medium: The goal is to balance the art collection to include a variety of media. Therefore, Selection Committee members are asked to be acquainted with, and to consider previously selected artwork, when choosing a new addition to the collection.



Selection Committee

The Selection Committee is composed of:

A representative of a public community art organization or interested citizen.

Two members of Truro Town Council.

A Parks, Recreation and Culture Department representative.

A professional or recognized artist.



Art Acquisition Show

The Annual Town of Truro Art Acquisition Show is co-hosted by the Town of Truro and the Truro Art Society. The show is open to the public and runs from April 4 - 26, 2019 at the McCarthy Hall Gallery, at the Nova Scotia Community College Campus.

Selection Process

Art Show: The one-month Art Show provides artists with the opportunity to display a maximum of three works of art for the Selection Committee and the general public.

Selection: After acquainting themselves with the submissions, the Selection Committee members then view all of the art work and convene to make a decision.

Announcement: A formal announcement of the selection is made at an opening reception hosted by the Town of Truro at the McCarthy Hall Gallery on Thursday, April 4 from 4:30-6:00pm for the artists, Selection Committee members, Truro Town Council, the public and the media.
